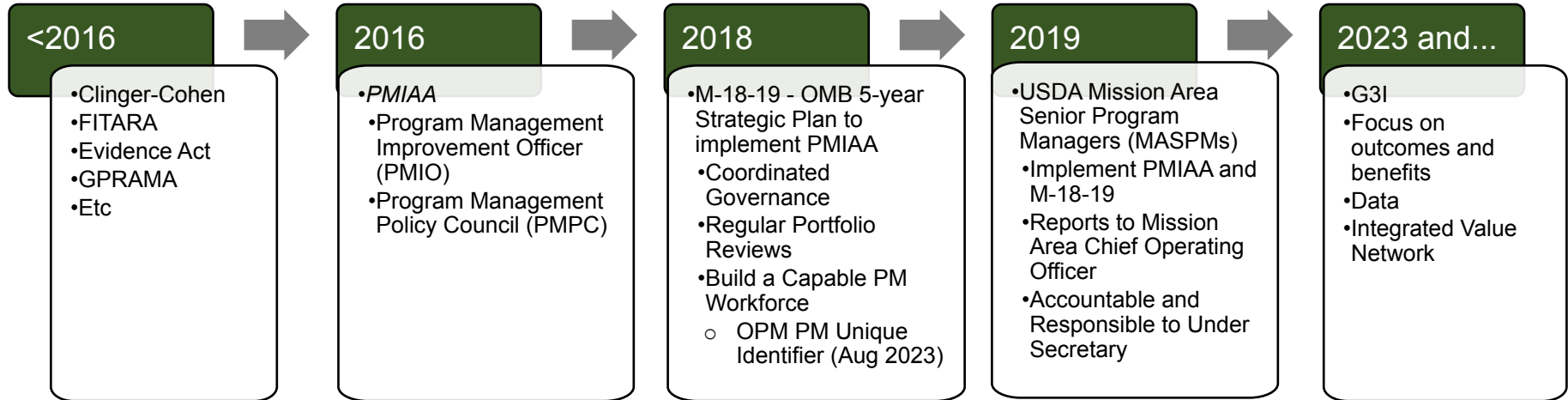

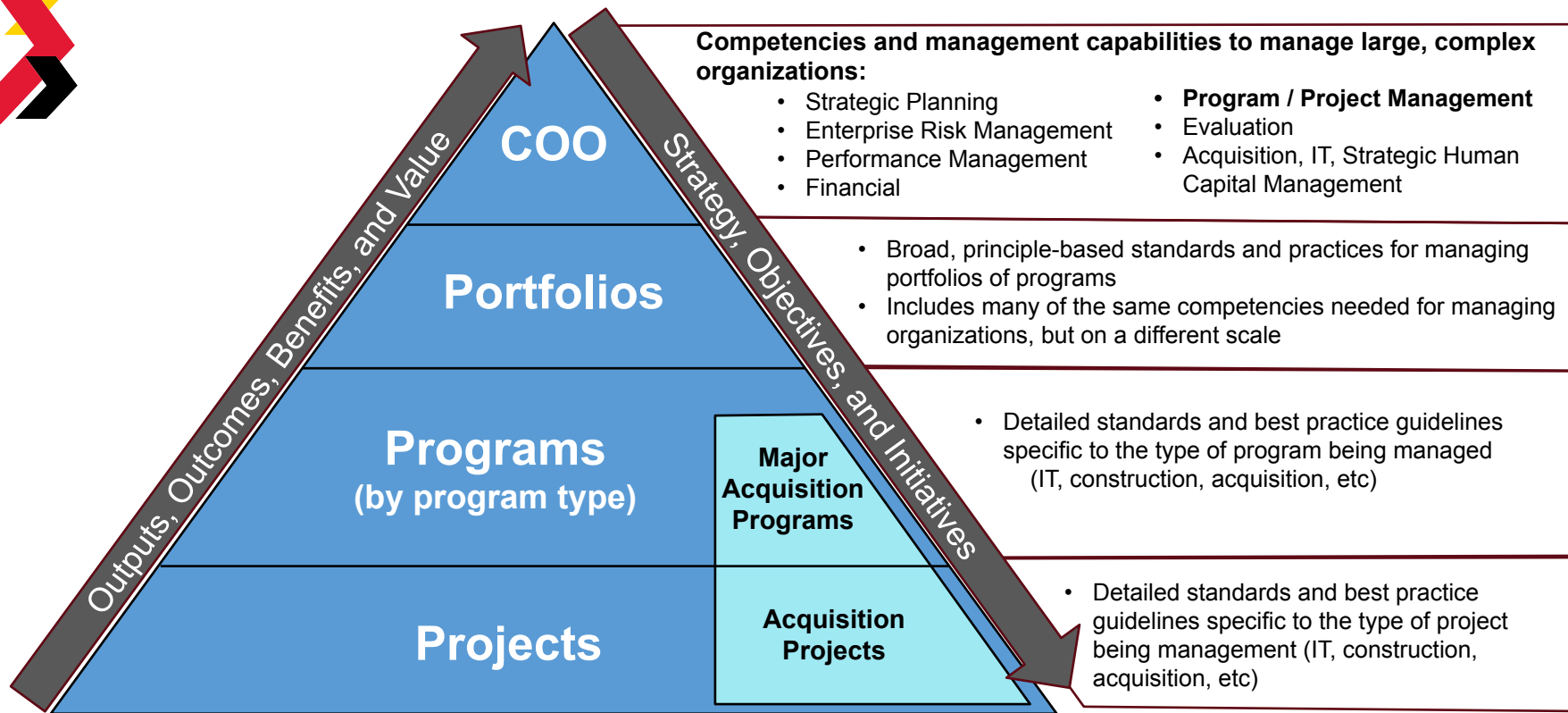




Past: P/PM Related Governance Artifacts & Initiatives

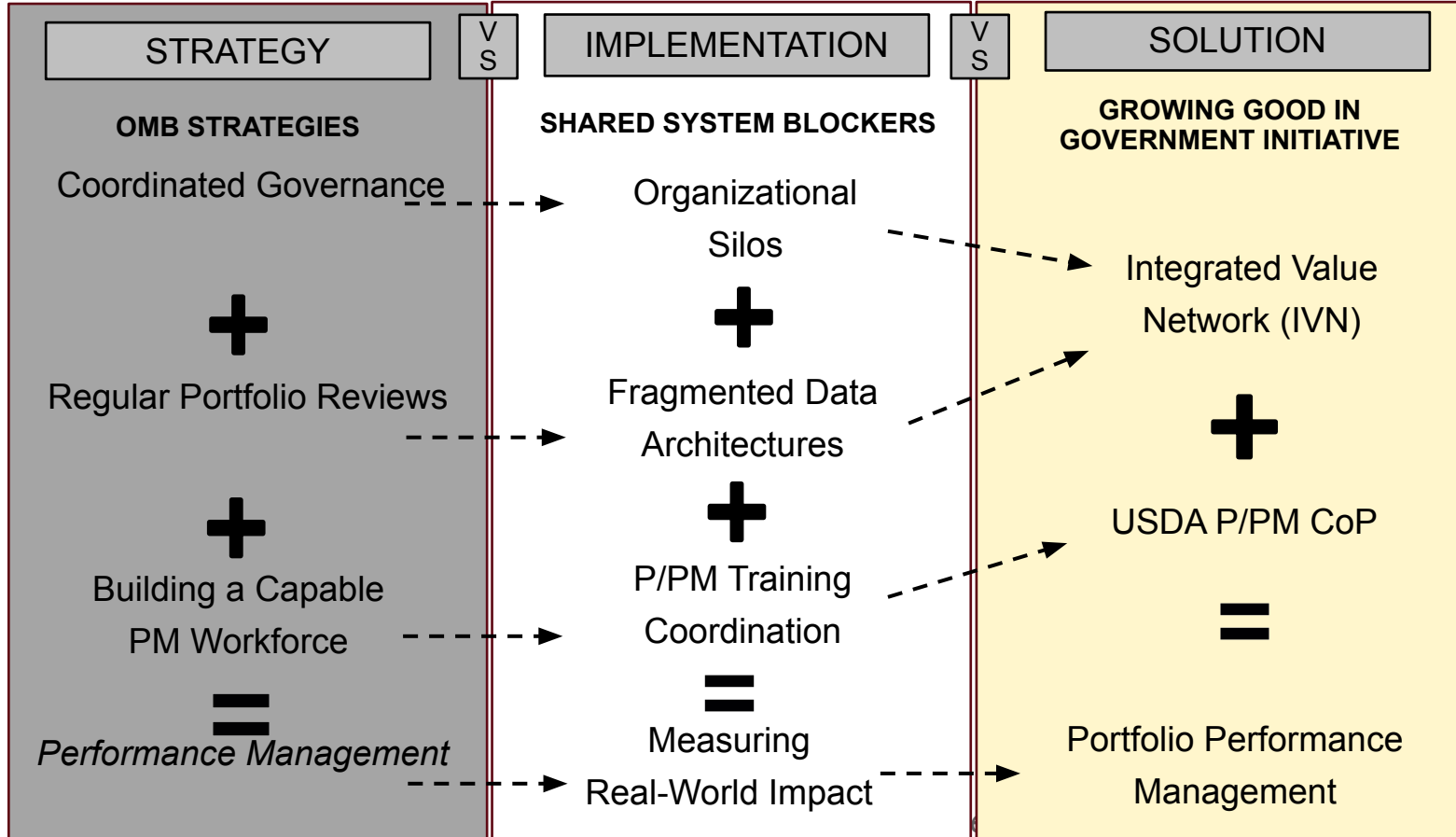

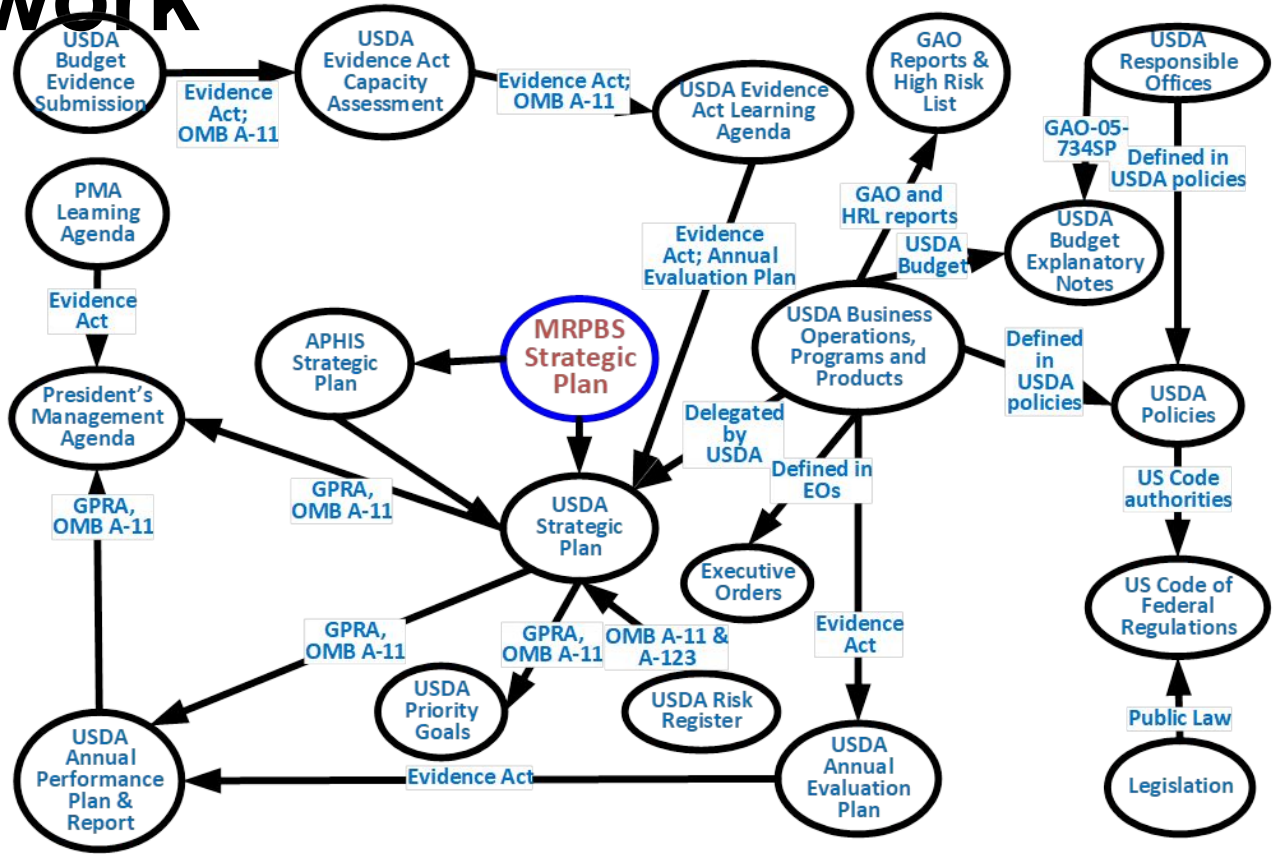

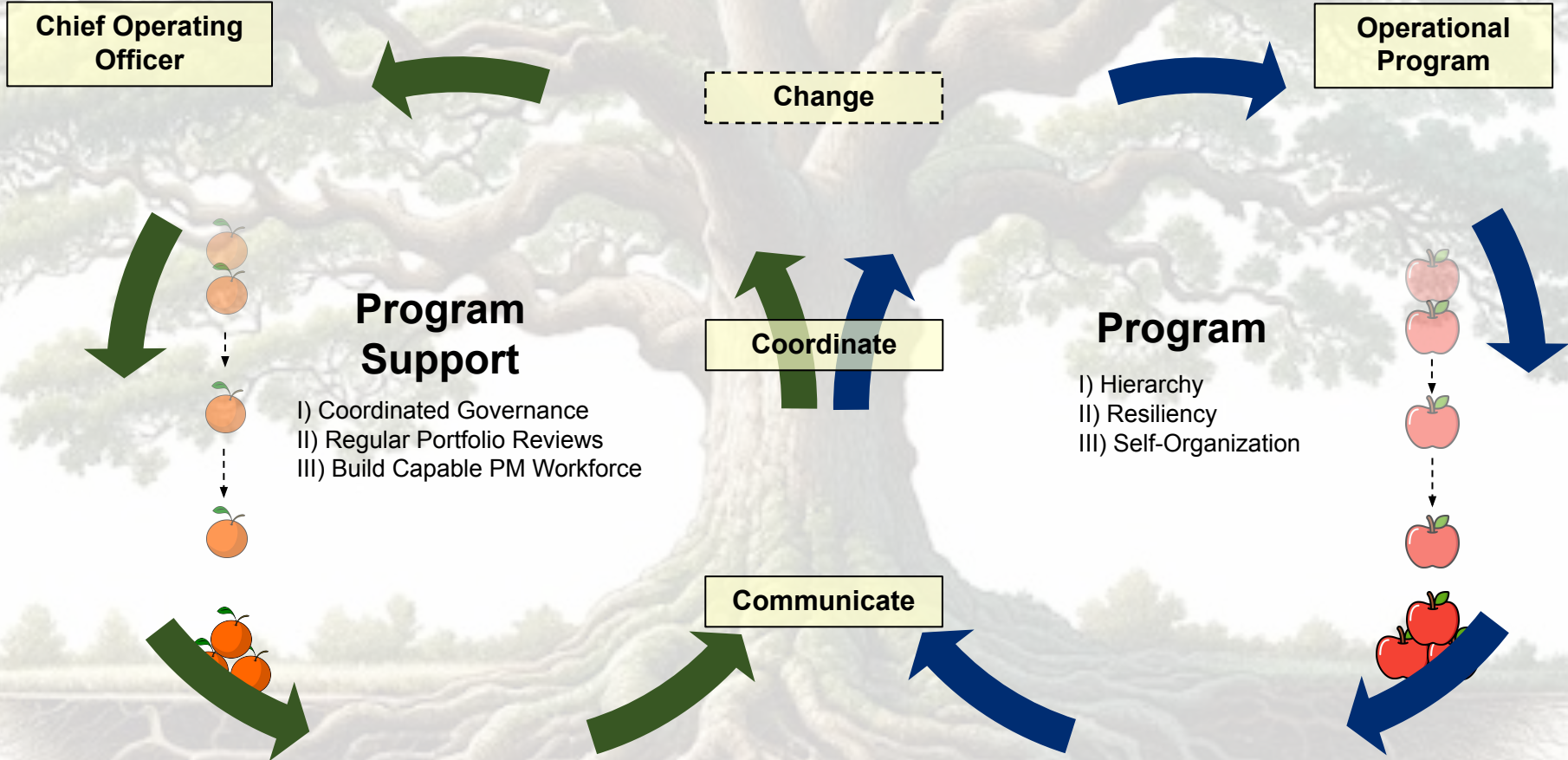
